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Prior to joining the Obama administration, Dr. Roberts was a member of the research staff at the Institute for Defense Analyses and adjunct professor at George Washington University. He has published widely on issues on nuclear deterrence, strategic stability, Asian security, the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, and U.S. defense policy. His most recent publications are *Extended Deterrence and Strategic Stability in Northeast Asia* (Tokyo: National Institute for Defense Studies, 2013) and *On the Strategic Value of Ballistic Missile Defense* (Paris, Institut Français des Relations Internationales, 2014). Now in production is a new book entitled *The Case for U.S. Nuclear Weapons in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*.

He has a doctorate in political science from Erasmus University, Rotterdam, The Netherlands (1996), an M.Sc. in International Relations from the London School of Economics and Political Science (1981), and a B.A. in International Relations from Stanford University (1976).
